While we have a new executive committee, some maintained their positions and most others are still supporting the Club one way or another. Former Tournament Director John Fruhmorgen is one such person and maintains a position as Fundraising Co-Chair and has committed to sharing with me all that knowledge he has gathered over his tenure as Tournament Director. We currently have 28 members entered in the fishing tournament and expect to match last seasons total of 58 members en-

This website is currently being upgraded but still contains all the clubs various endeavors which includes tournament rules and successes. For those Club members who only fish on occasion and are NOT entered in the Fishing Tournament, you are still eligible to win an end of the Season CASH prize as CASUAL FISHERPERSON of the year for heaviest fish based on highest percentage compared to Florida State record for that species sponsored by new to the club sponsor WHOLESALE MARINE (wholesalemarine.com) who in addition to cash sponsorships also offers members a 10% discount on boat supplies by using discount code KCB23.





MINUTES

Friday, November 4th, 2022

The November meeting of the Fishing & Boating Club was called to order by newly elected Commodore Sue Redding on November 4th at 5:00 pm at the KCB Public Works facility, with the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was held for the members we have lost. Past Commodores and veterans were recognized. No Charter Members were present. Beer and wine were available at 4:30 pm. 90 members were in attendance.

Commodore Sue Redding stated that the purpose of the Club is to promote fishing, boating and good fellowship among members. Established in 1994, the Club is one of the largest Fishing and Boating Clubs in the Florida Keys.

The minutes of the April meeting were accepted on a motion by Cindy Casey which was seconded by Jim Withrow and passed by the members.

Treasurer Stephanie Withrow read the Treasurer's Report which was accepted on a motion made by John Graves, seconded by Marie Flood and passed by the members.

Membership Chair Pat Fischer stated there are 237 current members in the Club. She announced Gail Cortelyou will be assisting with the membership duties this year. She reminded members' annual dues are due by the January meeting in order to stay active.

Director at Large Carman Slusher reminded members to get their volunteer hours in and to see a Board Member or contact Jim Lutz to see what opportunities are available.

Joey Raspe, Fundraising and Kids Fishing Derby Chair, announced that the 2022 Kids Fishing Derby was the most successful in the 16-year history of the Derby. There were a record 57 participants and over 20 chaperones who attended this year. In addition to supporting the event and supplying great prizes to the attendees, the fund was also used to give \$3,000 each to The Grace Jones Community Day Care Center and to The Sunshine Kids Foundation who support children with cancer. Next year's event will likely be the 2nd Wednesday in June and those who would like to volunteer to assist, please see Joey. Joey also reminded everyone prices are up on beer, wine and liquor so be generous in your donations to replenish the bar tip jar.

John Fruhmorgen, Fundraising, asked for help in supporting the very lucrative silent auction event at the annual Clam Bake. John reminded members that the event consistently brings in \$3,000 - \$5,000 per year and should be considered a major fundraiser for the Club. John asked for 10-15 members to volunteer to help with visiting the community businesses to get the certificates that are a big part of the revenue generated at the auction. Recording Secretary Diane Slusher thanked the members for the opportunity to serve. She had no new business at this time.

Tim Husel, Tournament Director, reminded members the Club is a fishing AND boating club and safety should be at the forefront of minds when doing so, especially when boarding an unfamiliar vessel. Tim suggested being proactive if the captain does not give an overview of operation and location of safety equipment, and to ask for it.

Tim thanked Ron Teke for providing a lead on a newly secured Club sponsor, www.wholesalemarine.com. They will also offer a member discount of 10% with code 'KCB23'.

Tim announced current tournaments then presented the prize money to the April winning anglers (below). Commodore Sue Redding reminded members there is no smoking at the Public Works facility. The Public Works facility does have a new restroom for our convenience. Sue also announced a Blood Drive will take place on November 9th from 9:30 AM - 2:30 PM according to their website.

Sue shared that our Sergeant of Arms Joe Stickney delivered a certificate of appreciation for the Club that was given by the Marathon American Legion in recognition and appreciation of service and compassion given to those that have served our Country.

Vice Commodore Tom Alferes added there are two Blood Drives this month. On November 9th at the Post Office from 9:30 AM - 2:30 PM and November 11th at the American Legion from 10:00 AM - 3:00 PM. He noted One Blood is providing very nice gifts in return for your donations. Tom emphasized the need to patronize and thank our sponsors. When you visit them, please let them know you are a member of the Club and that we greatly appreciate their sponsorships! He also noted Jim Lutz is tracking the volunteer hours and

to see him if you need to sign up. He reminded members that two hours are required the first year and one hour each year after is required to keep your membership in good standing. The Clam Bake alone needs 120 volunteers to pull off the event. Tom closed with an Uncle Manny joke.

Commodore Sue Redding announced Kitty Sutton will be holding a memorial service on November 20th from 11-2 and all are welcome to attend.

Sue thanked the members that helped with the 1st annual Pickleball Tournament that raised over \$3,300 which was donated to the city for improvements to the racquet sport complex for the tennis and pickleball players.

Ron Teke, Social Chairman, explained that our newest sponsors, Wholesale Marine have a local connection and history with the Club. The original owners Jim and Pat Stewart were Members of the Club but have since moved away. Their son, Jim Jr. has taken over the business and lives here in KCB on 10th street. Ron is hopeful the weather will cooperate for our Sunset Moonrise events this season. The next one is next week and if wind is under 15 knots, it's a go. He will also continue the monthly fishing seminars with various projects. He agreed with Tim's comments on boating safety and gave an example of a local tragedy due to a wife not knowing how to operate the couple's vessel. He suggested we put together a class for those who are interested.
