Minutes DECEMBER 2, 2022

The December meeting of the Fishing & Boating Club was called to order by Commodore Sue Redding on December 2nd, at 5:00 pm at the KCB Public Works facility, with the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was held for the members we have lost. Past Commodores were recognized. Present Past Commodores were Joe Schmidt, Chet Dunn and Tom Alferes. Veterans were asked to stand and were recognized. Charter Members Chet Dunn and Phil Flagg were recognized. Beer and wine were available at 4:30 pm. 91 members were in attendance.

Commodore Sue Redding stated that the purpose of the Club is to promote fishing, boating and good fellowship among members. Established in 1994, the Club is one of the largest Fishing and Boating Clubs in the Florida Keys.

The minutes of the April meeting were accepted on a motion by Joe Schmidt which was seconded by Karen Raspe and passed by the members.

Commodore Sue Redding announced that proposed By-Law changes were emailed to membership ahead of the meeting to address several points which Sue explained. They included but were not limited to membership fee due date moving to November and required volunteer hours increasing to 2 hours per year. Sue Bartkus suggested we keep the dues payable until January as many members do not come down until then. A motion was made by Barb Heitman to accept the By-Law changes which was seconded by Jim Withrow.

Sue shared that our new Sergeant at Arms will be Joe Schmidt.

Treasurer Stephanie Withrow read the Treasurer's Report which was accepted on a motion made by John Graves, seconded by Marie Flood and passed by the members.

Vice Commodore Tom Alferes announced that Greg Chorebanian (of The Wicked Tuna) donated a handmade fishing rod to be auctioned in the silent auction at this year's Clam Bake. Greg specifically asked it be auctioned and not sold in the general merchandise portion of the event.

Membership Chair Pat Fischer stated there are 50 current members with dues still unpaid to date. She reported 85 tickets have been sold to the New Year's Eve dinner and dancing event with entertainment by Rick and Dayna at the Elks.

Director at Large Carman Slusher reminded members to get their volunteer hours in and to see a Board Member to see what opportunities are available.

Joey Raspe, Fundraising and Kids Fishing Derby Chair (and newly appointed KCB Commissioner) passed the tip jar for the bar replenishment and reminded members prices were up.

Tim Husel, Tournament Director, reminded members of tuna, dolphin and other fishing limits. Tim announced current tournaments, then presented the prize money to the November winning anglers (below). OLD BUSINESS: Boat Parade Captain Ted Fischer stated we have just 7 boats signed up for this year's Christmas Boat Parade on Sunday, December 11th. Ted announced no one from the Club has signed up so the Board has approved two incentives for the next 5 Captains who sign up including a free entry into the fishing tournaments and 2 hours toward your volunteer hours.

NEW BUSINESS: Commodore Sue Redding announced she has a boat safety class 'Suddenly in Command' lined up and available for any members that would like to sign up. Sue proposed Wednesday January 11th from 3:30-5:30 at the Elks ahead of Rick and Dayna's performance. Class is free but donations are encouraged. An email registration form will be sent out to those who showed interest in attending.

Sue stated she has gotten interest from members to resume the pre-covid annual ritual to have a club brunch at Little Palm Island. They are no longer offering brunch but a luncheon would be available. The fee would be \$100 pp and the boat could accommodate up to 24 members at a time. Sue asked for a show of hands if she should continue to organize the event. Dates and details will come via email with a sign up form.

Ron Teke, Social Chairman, explained that a Sunset Moonrise event was held last month and will try again in December.

Only two boats participated in the rescheduled event and hope to have more next month.

Recording Secretary Diane Slusher had no new business at this time.

Sue thanked those that helped at tonight's meeting including Joey and Karen Raspe and Denise DeCrow for helping with the bar. The Fruhmorgens, Mike and Jessie for the meal. This month's greeters, the Linderhorns and the Duffy's for handling the 50/50 ticket sales.

With no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 5:55 pm on a motion made by Joe Schmidt, which was seconded by David Fischer, and passed by the members.
