MEETING MINUTES

Friday, November 6, 2021

The November meeting of the Fishing & Boating Club was called to order on November 6th at 6:30 pm at Marble Hall, with the Pledge of Allegiance. A moment of silence was observed to honor Club members who we lost this year and those who are facing challenging health issues including Don Russell. Past Commodores and veterans were recognized as well as charter members who were in attendance which were Chet Dunn and Phil Flagg. All CDC safety measures were observed. Beer, wine and spirits were available at 6 pm. 91 members were in attendance.

The minutes of the April meeting were accepted on a motion by Rick Quick which was seconded by Ken Duffy and passed by the members. Commodore Joe Schmidt stated that the purpose of the Club is to promote fishing, boating and good fellowship amongst members.

Commodore Joe Schmidt pointed out that the Rick Lieder Band was reserved for New Year's Eve but due to the likelihood of Marble Hall being under construction at that time, we needed to make a decision on whether to plan for an alternate location or release them. Two locations were offered in Marathon, The Moose and The Elks both at no charge to us. Details of the options were discussed. Jim Byland recommended we consider the Public Works building. Margie Casey suggested renting the Marathon Garden Club facility. Carman Slusher not-

ed that the Public Works would be local, and members would not have to drive out of KCB. Commodore Joe Schmidt asked for a show of hands of Clam Bake Captains in attendance and announced there would be a Captains meeting in January. He noted that Rick and Dayna are secured for that event as well and stated that there will be a limited number of tickets sold this year to keep the event more manageable

Commodore Schmidt then brought up KCB Day. Due to City Hall being under construction at that time, we will be in an alternate location and provisions for getting and disposing of salt water for the barracuda races would have to be made. City Administrator Dave Turner stated the 7th street park would be the best option for the event from his perspective due to power and parking. Ted Fischer suggested we access water from a Club members house on 7th street. Pat Fischer noted the Community Association had not yet decided on the location and that it was the 65th year for the event. Chet Dunn asked for confirmation of the date so he could invite The Shriners. Date was confirmed as March 6th.

Commodore Joe Schmidt noted Director at Large Danny Grimm will provide the meal with chili and cornbread at Decembers meeting and we needed volunteers for future meetings. Ron Teke announced he will be providing the meal in February and will include a pulled pork, beef brisket, Texas BBQ with sides and a dessert.

One Blood will be at the KCB City Hall parking lot on Wednesday, November 10th from 9:30 am until 2:30 pm. All were encouraged to make reservations and donate as there is an extreme blood shortage.

Commodore Joe Schmidt thanked: Sis Tremblay and Barb Heitman, check-in; Ron and Kitty Sutton, 50/50 ticket sales; Joey and Karen Raspe, bar service; Sue Thompson for assisting Member Secretary Pat Fischer. Vice Commodore Suzan Redding had no business at this time.

Treasurer Stephanie Withrow read the Treasurer's Report which was accepted on a motion duly made by Jim Withrow, seconded by Flo Roseboro and passed by the members.

Joey Raspe passed the bar replenishment fund jar and asked members to be generous in their donations to restock the bar. He announced that there is great interest in holding the Kids Fishing Derby this year since it was canceled two years in a row due to covid concerns. He noted this is the 15th anniversary for the event and asked us to support long time sponsors Marathon Lady and Key Colony Inn.

Membership Secretary Pat Fischer asked members to get their dues in by the January meeting and if their contact information has changed to please update it with her.

Tournament Director John Fruhmorgen presented the prize money to the winning anglers (attached). John reminded members to thank our sponsors when doing business with them. Tournament dues are now \$70.
